Despite the significant growth of Computer Science and Engineering and the exciting career prospects, there are still severe gender disparities in the STEM field, and especially in the computer science and engineering domain. The goal of the Summit is also to celebrate and disseminate the achievements of computer professionals in a fair and gender-equal way.

Through a series of activities (including invited talks, workshops, panels, interaction with the industry, poster sessions, and other activities), attendees will have the opportunity to become acquainted to current and emerging topics and important achievements in computer science (CS), as well as to participate in discussions on gender equality issues in STEM (and more generally in academia, research and industry).
